SPRING GARDENING

>>> PLANTING TIPS

- Don't get too eager: Wait for the soil to dry, especially from all the downpours we've been getting. Working on wet soil leads to compaction which kills your microbes!
- Check your soil temp: make sure your soil is warm enough to start direct seeding into. Planting into warm soil will help germination.
- Don't cut your grass or clean up debris yet: wait to clean up until the days are consistently warmer than 10 degrees Celsius. This gives time for your beneficial insects wake up and emerge from the debris cover. Avoid cutting your grass so that the beneficials have something to feed on once they wake up and emerge.

>>> BEE A MINDFUL GROWER

Supporting pollinators and beneficial insects goes beyond waiting to clean up garden debris. Integrating native plants into your garden or field spaces will help help attract beneficial bees, butterflies, birds and other insects. In field settings pollinator strips are helpful for supporting both your plants and animals! Pollinators ensure that our ecosystems and crops flourish

Use local business to buy native plants or some public organizations have pollinator seed mixes.
